VAT and Indirect Taxes Partner, MHA Moore and Smalley

Jonathan will focus on Brexit, as we should have clarity on our future relationship with the EU after the end of the Transition Period on 31 December 2020.

He will provide a practical explanation of our trading relationship from 1 January 2021. He will walk through the steps that businesses can take to ensure that the flow of goods between the UK and the EU happens as smoothly as possible in the new world.

Jonathan will also provide a brief overview of potential changes to VAT and other indirect taxes once we are no longer bound by EU Directives governing the operation of indirect taxes in the UK. In summary, his presentation will give you the tools you need to face the future outside the EU.
